Hi Guys. Over the past couple months we have been on a quest to find out more about Jesus. And more specifically what Jesus said about himself.

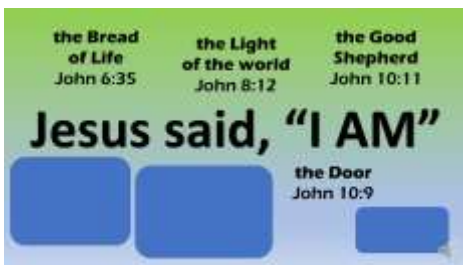
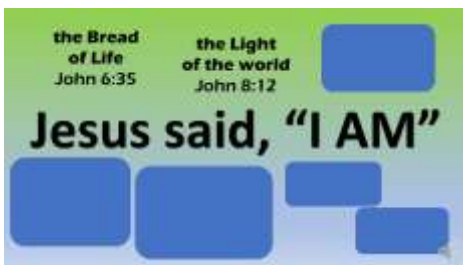
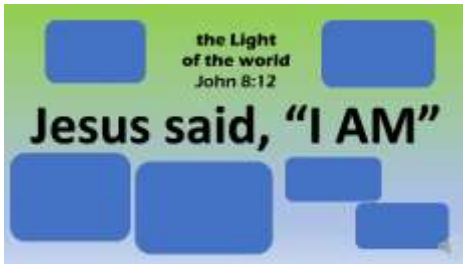

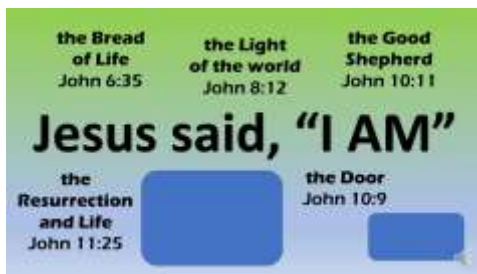
The dead man came out, his hands and feet wrapped with strips of linen, and a cloth round his face.



Jesus said to them ‘take off the grave clothes and let Lazarus go.’



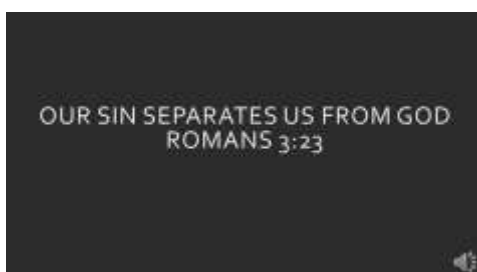
Then many people who had come to visit Mary and Martha saw what Jesus did and they believed in Him.

You see God loves us so much and wants us to live with him. It says in John 3:16, “For God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him shall not perish, but have eternal live.”



But there is a problem. We all sin. Sin is anything that we do that doesn’t please God. And even what may seem like the smallest sin, creates a wall between us and God. God can’t be around sin at all. It says in Romans 3:23, “for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God.” And we can’t do enough good to make up for the sin that we do.

Will you believe

The price for our sin was a perfect sacrifice, that we could not do ourselves. So God sent Jesus to die on the cross as the payment for our sin. Romans 6:23 says, "For the wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord. Jesus paid the price for our sin.

So what do we need to do? As with any gift we need accept God's forgiveness and the free gift of eternal life. Romans 10:9-10 says, "that if you confess with your mouth Jesus as Lord, and believe in your heart that God raised Him from the dead, you will be saved; for with the heart a person believes, resulting in righteousness, and with the mouth he confesses, resulting in salvation."

What happens next? Talk to God. Confess your sins to Him and let Him know that you believe in Jesus and that he died on the cross to save you from your sins. Then make Jesus the most important relationship you have. Get to know him better by reading your Bible and going to church, talk to him in prayer and worship Him by lifting up his name in song and by serving others in His name.

Will you believe in Jesus? The choice is yours. I made that decision years ago and have never regretted it.
